All the untreated or undertreated health concerns of the patients are recognized and can be treated with the help of consultant pharmacists. The entire medication regimen is carefully reviewed, including prescription R_X, dietary supplements, herbal products and over the counter drugs, to determine whether the drug is correct with respect to disease, dosed correctly, and affordable for the patient. Results: Thus, consultant pharmacists have to have the best knowledge of all the drug related aspects including the pharmacology and pharmacognosy of synthetic as well as herbal medicines.

I. INTRODUCTION

Consultant is a person who provides expert advice professionally and pharmacist is a health care professional who learns and practices in pharmacy focusing on safe and effective use of medicines. Together, consultant pharmacists work as counselors providing expert advice on the use of medicines to medical institutions, medical practices, nursing homes and individual patients wherever they live. They are essential clinicians on the health care team providing patient-centered care and influencing decision making in the medication therapy.

At present, consultant pharmacists have gained a tremendous recognition throughout the world. They are equally involved with the medical team during the treatment of patients.

1.2. History and Development

The founding father of this clinical work is George F. Archambault. He created the phrase "consultant pharmacist". The idea originated in the nursing home environment where a group of dedicated pharmacists focused on improving the patient outcomes [1].

By sharing a common goal to enhance the quality of care for all the patients, consultant pharmacists now practice in other settings also such as (i) assisted living facilities, (ii) psychiatric hospitals, (iii) sub-acute and post-acute care, (iv) in home and community based care.

The two main countries in which the practices of consultant pharmacists are being observed are: United States of America (USA) and United Kingdom (UK). Many other countries are also engaged in providing better healthcare system through the practices of consultant pharmacists.

In USA, the organization named as 'The American Society of Consultant Pharmacists' (ASCP) is dedicated to all older patients and their management of medicines. They provide improved and better health outcomes. It was founded in 1969, and is a non-profit membership organization which is currently based in Alexandria, VA. Here, consultant pharmacists focus on reviewing and managing the prescriptions of patients, particularly in the nursing homes and hospitals. Their main agenda is to ensure that their patient's medicines are suitable, effective, and safe. Also, the patients get information about the route of administration of particular medicines. This group of pharmacists identifies and prevents the problems that may interfere with the goals of therapy and thus provides better results.

In the UK's National Health Services (NHS), consultant pharmacist has advanced roles in patient health care, education and research in an expert area of practice. The Department of Health (DH) for England produced guidance related to the posts of consultant pharmacists in 2005. The guidance described the roles of

consultant pharmacists and the posts are intended to be new and innovative. This helped in improving patient care by retaining clinical excellence [2, 3].

II. METHODS

2.1. How to Become a Consultant Pharmacist

The University Of Florida, College Of Pharmacy is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) as a provider of continuing pharmacy education. They provide the following courses, (i) Initial Certification, (ii) Recertification, (iii) Redefining and refining the treatment approaches to Cardiovascular medicine, (iv) Optimizing Geriatric care [4].

Those who have passed diploma and degree in pharmacy education and are registered pharmacists of their country can also work as consultant pharmacists in different institutions. The only requirement is to have appropriate degree and sound knowledge of pharmacology related to various drugs and their interactions.
